## Ready, Set, Secure: Navigating Emergencies with Ease

As we move through Spring and into Summer, creating an emergency kit for your home is crucial in preparing for unexpected situations. Here's a comprehensive list of items to include in your emergency kit:

- Pack some basic supplies: water, non-perishable food (don't forget a manual can opener), a first aid kit, flashlights, batteries, a battery-powered or hand-crank radio, and a multi-tool or Swiss army knife.
- Consider these additional essentials: blankets or sleeping bags, personal hygiene items, important documents (stored in a waterproof container), cash, and a whistle.
- Have a Go-Bag ready: extra clothing, pet supplies, emergency contact information (including medical and police services, etc.), entertainment and comfort items, special needs items, and local maps. Include maps of your area in case GPS or digital maps are inaccessible.
- Have a plan: Consider evacuation routes, meeting points, and communications in case of separation, and have alternative shelter plans.

- Have a backup power source: Get a generator or alternative power source, and have extra fuel if needed.
- Get educated: Take first aid, CPR, and basic emergency response classes. These skills can be critical in an emergency situation.
